If you are coming from the QEW:

Exit on Hurontario (Hwy 10) and go north; turn left (west) on Burnhamthorpe Road West; turn right (north) on Living Arts Drive.

If you are coming from Hwy 401, Hwy 403, or Hwy 407:

Exit on Hurontario (Hwy 10) and go south. Turn Right (west) on Rathburn Road West. Then turn Left (south) onon Duke of York Blvd. Then turn Right on Princess Royal Drive or City Centre Drive to get to Living arts Drive.
